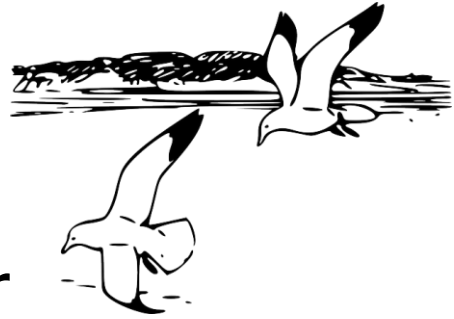


2018 Spring News letter

The Town of Nags Head ended Bulk pick up March 31st this year. We have found out that it may not be picked up for a few weeks. However if you did not call 441-1122 before March 31st and are not on the list you may have to seek other means of disposing of the items. You can get a free pass at the Town of Nags Head office for the 8th Street Dump on the Town of Nags Head Website.

We will soon issue a contract for a new roof for the clubhouse. This is one of several major expenses we had to consider for future use of our funds. And it is time for this roof replacement! Other items are replacing the bulkheads at the end of the canals (2 remaining) and possibility of a wading pool should this become a priority for the membership plus channel dredging. These will be discussed at the annual meeting.

The Town has promised to remove all debris (called in to Public Works at 252 441 1122) and have ROW clean before our annual meeting. Too late to put anything else out as mentioned previously in this newsletter but get a free sticker at Town Hall and take your items to the Eight St drop off. They even have someone to help you.

The Board of Directors has also been looking into and researching other ways to continue to improve our neighborhood. Coyotes have been a major concern and one of the topics. We have looked into some options, however the trapping season is
